



Oslo Short Film Festival 2023

31 August - 1 September 2023 at the Sentralen (Forstanderskapssalen)

The Oslo Short Film Festival 2023 is coming on the 31st of August and 1st of September with a multifaceted two-day screening programme of the freshest indie cinema releases. Once again, we set our big screen to the artsy halls of the Sentralen bringing independent cinema to the heart of the Kvadraturen neighbourhood.

This year's edition will be hosted in Sentralen's refined **Forstanderskapssalen** hall. Lying on the 3rd floor of Sentralen, the modern-equipped hall with classic decoration offers the perfect setting for high-quality screening in a cosy and intimate atmosphere that fully encompasses the Festival's character.

Running for two days, OSFF23 features **19 short narratives and documentaries** by filmmakers from all walks of life. This year's screening programme runs the gamut of comedy and feel-good to drama and real-life stories, with each screening slot carefully curated to take the audience on a cinematic journey.

On **August 31st**, screening slots 1 and 2 explore the sense of belonging with two programmes that dive into family bonds and the sense of belonging in a community. Among others, day one features "**Unborn Biru**" by the Norwegian filmmaker Inga Elin Marakatt, which was part of the Sundance 2023 shorts programme and won the "Films from the North" award at the Tromsø International Film Festival 2023, the 10-times awarded "**Demon Box**" (Canada) by Sean Wainsteim and the Documentaries "**The Trip**" (Rimantas Oičenka, Lithuania) and "**Harvesting Our Tea**" (Sheida Kiran, United Kingdom).

The **Day 2** screening programme is dedicated to stories inspired by real-life events born during crises or everyday relationships. Through 10 narratives and documentaries, the second day of the OSFF23 has a more anthropocentric approach presenting challenges humans face throughout the world.

The awarded short animated "Mariupol. A Hundred Nights" takes us into the war zone through the story of a little girl, who wakes up in a burning city and tries to find someone to help her survive. Using the voice of the legendary Marianne Faithfull, the natural history fantasy film

"Wild Summon" (Official Selection Cannes Film Festival 2023 - Short Film Competition) follows the dramatic life cycle of the wild salmon in human form.

Finally, in the 2023 Crystal Bear-winner "Man khod, man ham miraghsam (And Me, I'm Dancing Too)", emerges a moving portrait of a generation of young Iranians hemmed in by the Islamic republic's rigid rules. Lying between documentary and fiction, the boundaries between the imaginary and reality eventually dissolve.

On both days, programmes compose a common narrative that is shared through the various aesthetics and perspectives of each filmmaker. Our aim is to take the audience on a journey to various places and cultures giving birth to emotions while sparking new conversation. Counting four years since its foundation, the Oslo Short Film Festival has supported hundreds of filmmakers and has built a community that keeps expanding.
